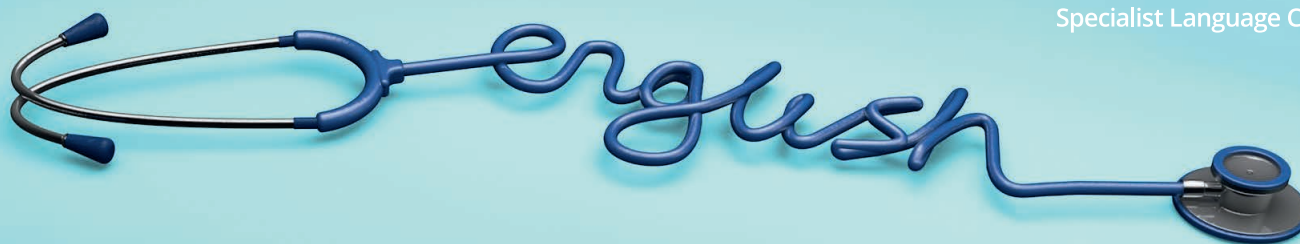

## About the Course
