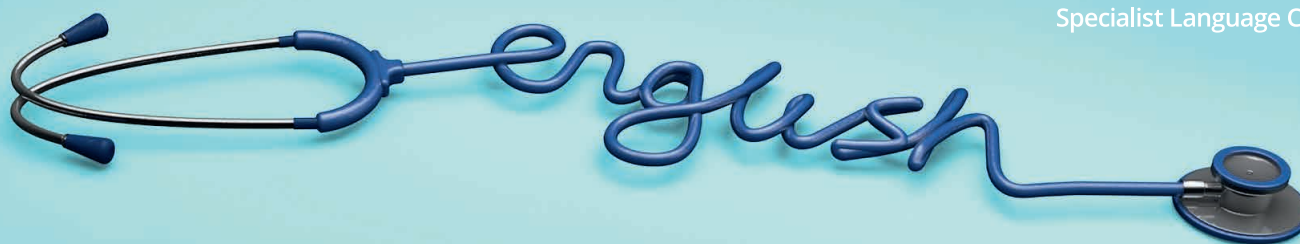

## About the Course

<b>Course Length</b>	100 hours of study, divided into 10 clearly defined 10-hour sections. Each section focuses on a vital area of practice, giving nurses the tools to perform effectively at work. Students have 4 months to complete the course.
<b>Course Level</b>	The course is set at an intermediate level (B1 – B2 in the Common European Framework). At this level, a student can understand and communicate reasonably well in most common situations, including travel, work and family.
<b>Inputs</b>	During the course, learners watch videos, listen to conversations, read medical texts, analyse charts and graphs, look at work-related photographs and images, and study vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation focus points.
<b>Exercises</b>	Learners take a wide range of exercises to help learn the language nurses need. The exercises concentrate on profession-specific language and work-based scenarios.
<b>Progress Assessment</b>	Students can track their results and the time they spend online. And at the end of every unit, there is a progress assessment so they can see what they have learnt.
<b>Course Accreditation</b>	The course is accredited by the CPD Standards Office in the UK, whose professional qualifications are recognised worldwide.
<b>End of Course CPD Certificate</b>	On successful completion, students receive 80 CPD points and a CPD-stamped Certificate with details of the course level and content.
