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IELTS Preparation Courses

SLC has been preparing healthcare professionals for IELTS since 2014, including nurses, doctors, AHPs and social workers.

The exam remains a popular choice, despite testing academic and general English, rather than healthcare English. It is widely recognised by regulators as well as the UK Border Agency, has an extensive test centre network and a well-established resources and practice infrastructure.

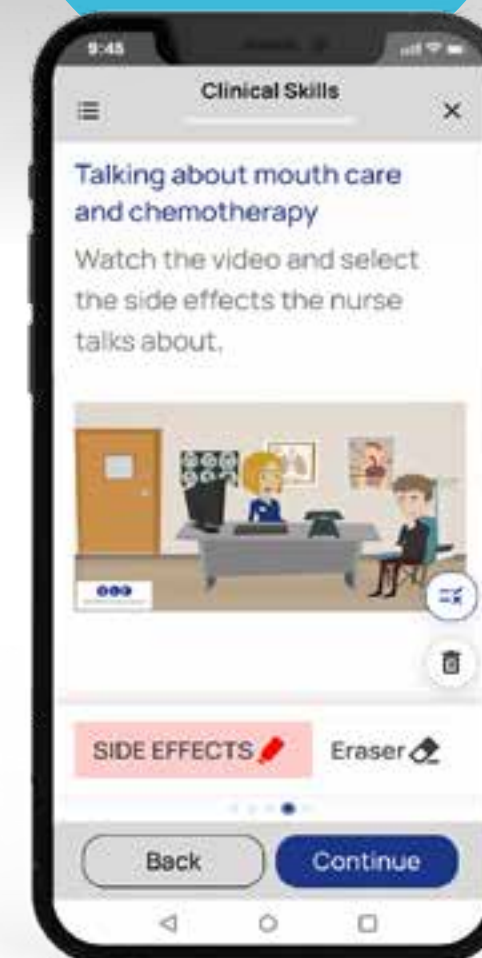
Preparation for the Nursing OSCE is packed with tips, strategies, language and communication skills that provide invaluable support to on-site OSCE courses.

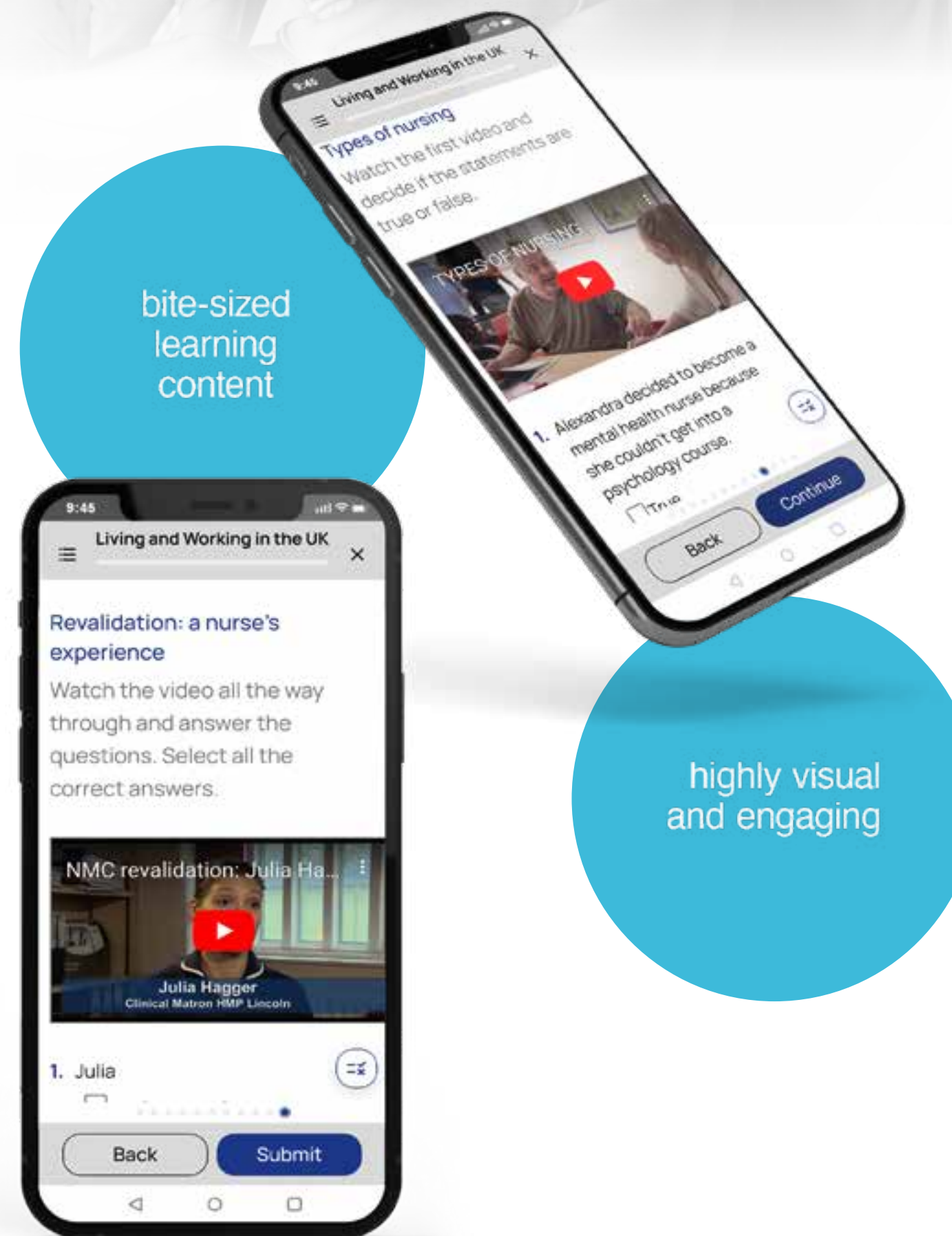
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Living and Working in the UK (Nurses edition)

English for Healthcare Support Workers

Overseas healthcare support workers make a vital contribution to UK healthcare, providing essential care for patients and service users in multiple care settings.

Medical Language and Communication Courses

Even if overseas healthcare professionals have passed their English language test they may struggle to communicate effectively with patients. Others may wish to present at seminars and conferences, or publish their research in English.

They may be overly direct on the ward, for example, or not know how to 'translate' medical terms into lay language that patients and their relatives understand. The grammar used in a handover, email or an article may be inaccurate and confuse others. Communication may break down as a consequence, and care negatively impacted.

SLC's medical language and communication courses are designed to help. Courses are profession-specific and cross-sector, covering a wide range of language and how to apply it in practical healthcare settings.

Courses are self-study and can be taken on PCs and smartphones via an app. Employers can track progress at any time.

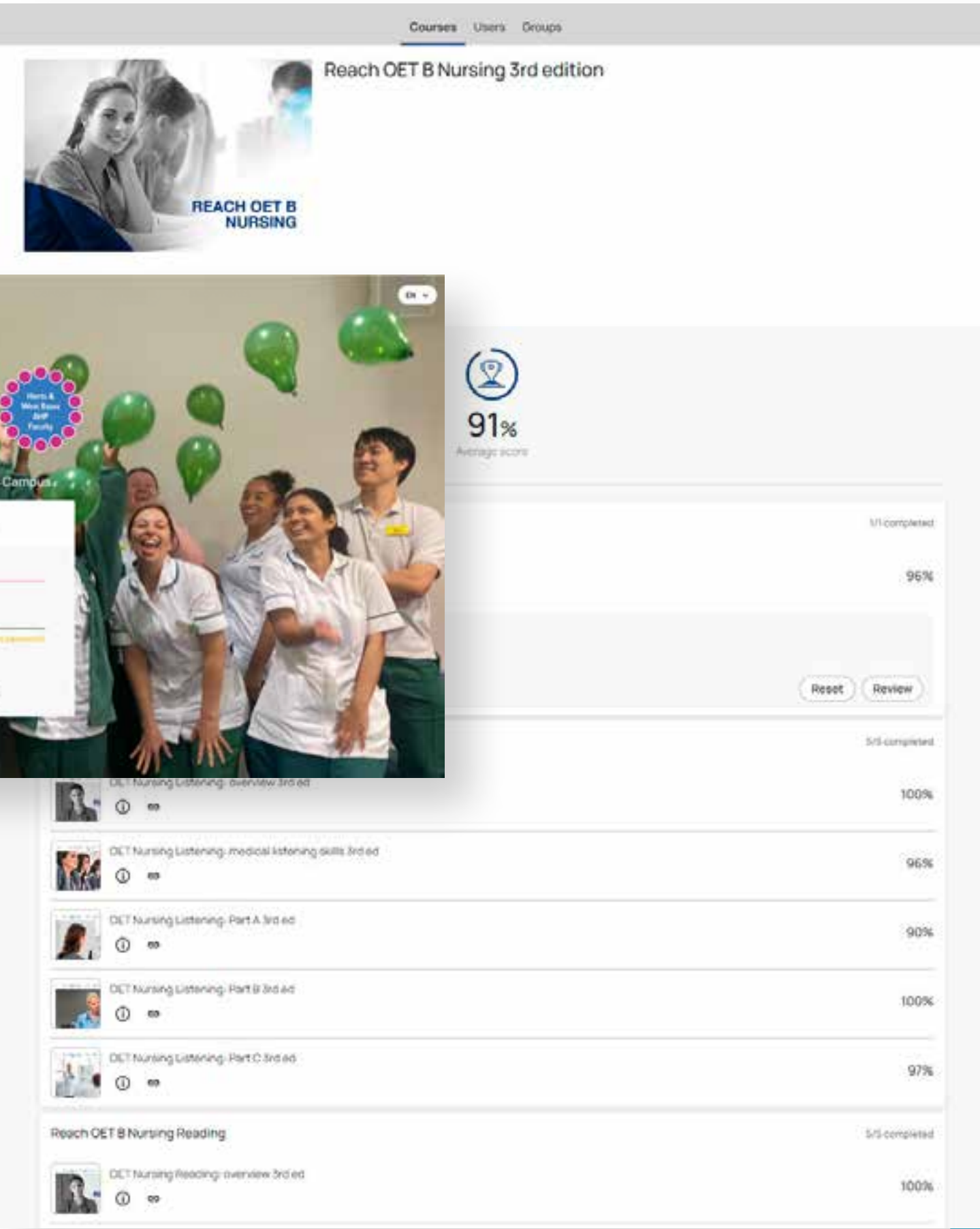
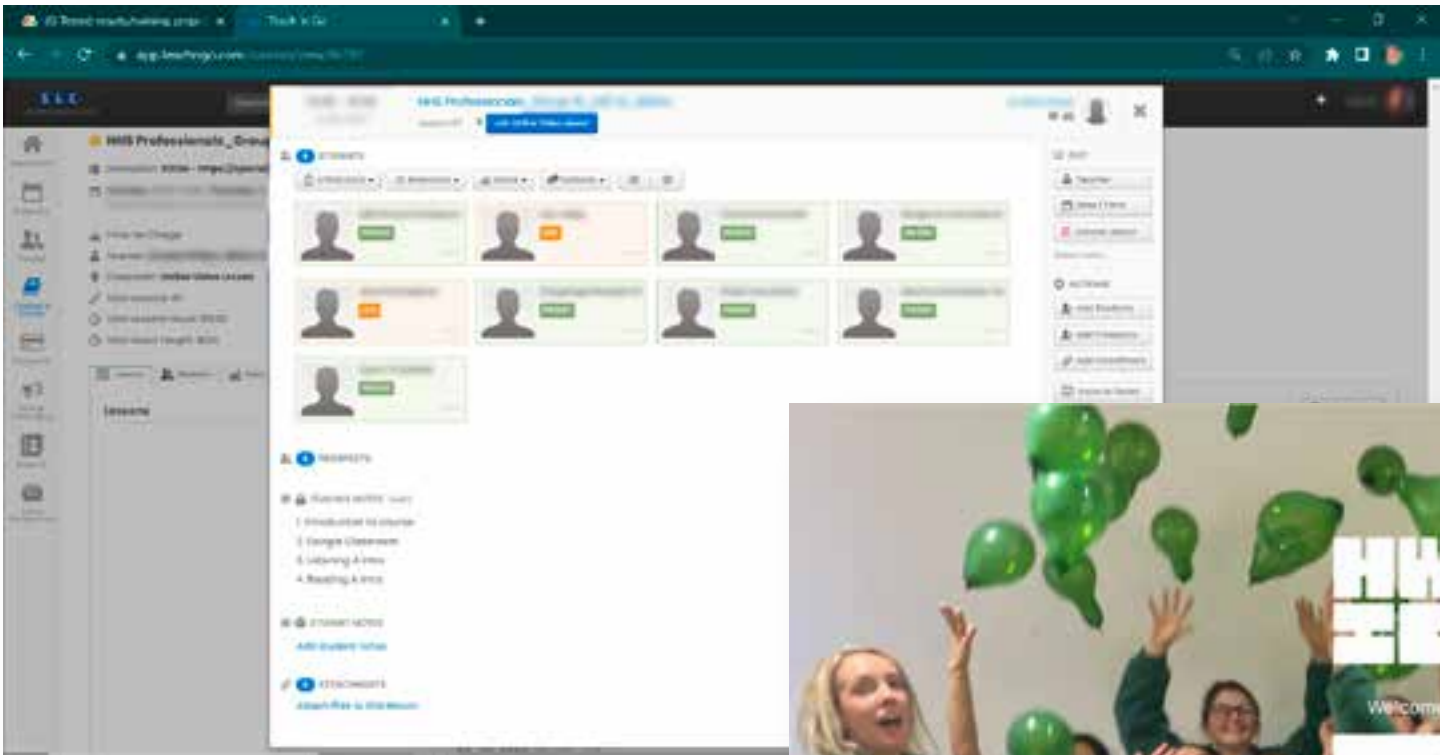

Tracking Candidate Progress

Candidates learn on an online platform designed for employers to be able to see ‘at a glance’ what their candidates have achieved and the progress they have made, including via an app on their phones.

On tutored courses, class attendance is always available with teacher comments. After mock tests, the academic team schedule reviews with employers to review and report on candidate progress towards their tests.

Candidate 1	80%	71%	27	32	Candidate 1 didn't manage to finish the reading A this time around and this is a persistent issue with this part of the test so it's recommended that she practices techniques to develop speed reading. With writing, just some more practice needed with structure as there were too many elements included in the 2nd section (so I advised a more thematic approach). Almost test ready.
Candidate 2	71%	74%	27	30	Candidate 2 found the listening C quite challenging due to the topic and multiple choice format. I have suggested some strategies to help with this part. Speaking and writing are looking good apart from some lack of expansion in places in the writing and some absolute phrases in the speaking that needed a bit of hedging. Almost test ready.
Candidate 3	79%	68%	26	28	Candidate 3 didn't manage to finish the reading C in the exam so I've suggested that he puts extra focus on reading C style texts as well as speed reading techniques. With writing, just needs a bit more attention placed on content as there was missing information (medications) so I advised that he look at the model letter to compare with his own one. Almost test ready.
Candidate 4	89%	83%	27	32	Candidate 4 is doing very well to reach test readiness despite the fact she has a hectic lifestyle at the moment (heavily pregnant) and had a bit of a struggle in the listening C which is perhaps not indicative of her true capabilities. Nevertheless, she suggested some ideas and resources to help with the listening C part. She is test ready but will likely take the exam later on in the year after her birth has settled.
Candidate 5	71%	62%	27	28	Candidate 5 is doing well on the course and is close to test readiness in speaking and listening. The writing is also very good apart from some language errors related to tense and modals. The reading is a big focus for her as she struggles to finish the reading A on time and finds the part C difficult. I have recommended some resources she can use to help her with this.
Candidate 6	88%	74%	27	30	Candidate 6 is test ready according to the results of this test but after talking with her, she will be on holiday over the Summer and won't return until August so she's planning to take the exam around that time. This will give her plenty of time to prepare with the help of the course as well as in self study.
Candidate 7	79%	62%	28	29	Candidate 7 is making some good progress on the course especially with his speaking and listening. However, more practice for writing is required in particular with coherence and clarity as his text was too long this time around. With the reading, the part C is quite challenging for him so it is advisable that he takes the opportunity to practice reading more academic styled texts in his self study. Not test ready yet.
Candidate 8	83%	98%	27	32	Candidate 8 is doing exceptionally well on the course and already looks test ready. I have advised to wait until after the second mock test to check if she can produce the same level of performance for that test as she has done for this one and she has agreed.
Candidate 9	71%	62%	28	30	Candidate 9 is doing very well with her listening and speaking as she produced some great performances. The reading needs a bit more work specifically with the A part as developing speed reading should be a focus. With writing, just some more attention needed for content as there was some missing information. Almost test ready.
