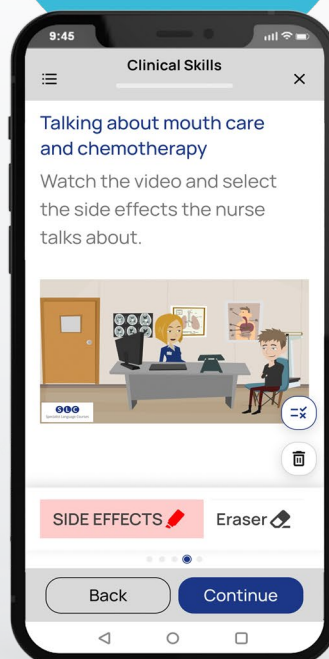

Learn about how OSCEs are structured, what to expect on the day, tips for success and a guide on what not to do.

APIE (Assessment, Planning, Implementation, Evaluation)

The APIE OSCE stations focus on the APIE process. Learn how APIE is applied to the scenarios covered by the Nursing OSCE and the language needed for the test:

- ✓ **Anxiety and depression**
- ✓ **Asthma**
- ✓ **Heart failure**
- ✓ **Falls and fractures**
- ✓ **Hernias**
- ✓ **Community care home**
- ✓ **Ectopic pregnancy**
- ✓ **Pneumonia**
- ✓ **Homelessness**
- ✓ **Subdural haematoma**

Learn about the APIE marking criteria, tools and processes; NHS-specific approaches to patient assessment, care plans, drug administration and infection control; key language and communication skills.

The clinical skills OSCE stations test practical nursing skills. Learn the essential language and communication skills you need to demonstrate your clinical skills in the many topics covered by the Nursing OSCE:

Professional Values

The Professional Values stations are silent, involving a written response to an article or scenario. In this course you study the professional values described by the NMC, including the '6 Cs'. You then learn how those values are applied and the language you need to use, focusing on the scenarios covered by the Nursing OSCE:

- ✓ **Bullying**
- ✓ **Patient confidentiality and sharing information with a third party**
- ✓ **Dishonesty**
 - concealment of bed status
 - falsifying observations
 - false representation
 - falsifying timesheets
 - consuming hospital food
- ✓ **Drug error**
- ✓ **Possible abuse and safeguarding, witnessed abuse in care home**
- ✓ **Inappropriate use of social media, racism in social media**
- ✓ **Concerns about impaired performance**
- ✓ **Confrontation with a colleague**

The Evidence of Best Practice OSCE stations are also silent and ask you to write a response to an article which should demonstrate your application of best practice. Learn the language and skills needed to show evidence of best practice from the OSCE topics:
